



RYA Scotland Elite Team Selection Policy

Introduction

This programme is an equivalent to the RYA HPC days received by English athletes.

Selection to the RYA Scotland Elite Team will be determined by Selectors appointed by the Performance Committee and will be the athletes who, in their opinion, will have the best prospects of progressing to the GBR Podium Potential Pathway (P3) Podium Potential (PP) and Podium (P) Squads. Selections will be made annually in April.

The Elite Team is a progression from the RYA Scotland Development Teams, Athletes will normally be current GBR Youth and Junior Squad members or achieved results in the top 10% at a UK National, European or World Championships in the previous season.

Number of athletes in the team will vary depending upon the strength and depth of talent in Scotland.

Athletes must be committed to following the RYA Team GBR pathway. There is no formal application process for the RYA Scotland Elite Team, sailors will instead be invited by the selectors.

Eligibility

To be eligible for selection, an athlete should meet the age criteria below. In addition an athlete shall hold or be eligible to hold a British passport, and be eligible to represent Great Britain in the Olympic Games. In exceptional circumstances, athletes who do not comply with this may nevertheless be eligible and selected, if expressly confirmed by the RYAS High Performance Manager. Such athletes will be required to carry GBR on their sails.

Athletes should also have a primary place of residence in Scotland and have progressed through the RYA Scotland Performance Pathway to be considered for the RYA Scotland Elite Team. If Athletes are attending full time education outside of Scotland where they are required to board on or near campus this address will be considered as their primary residence.

Athletes will normally be current GBR Youth and Junior Squad members or achieved results in the top 10% at a UK National, European or World Championships in the previous season.

RYA Scotland Selectors may decide to include out of age athletes within team training at their discretion. Athletes falling into this category should write a formal letter for support to the RYA Scotland HPM by the end of March each year and will be eligible for consideration for a discretionary place.

Athletes must meet the physical fitness benchmarks set by British Youth Sailing Pathway Sport Science Team.

Athletes are not eligible to receive both Elite Team support and HPC support simultaneously.

Athletes who feel they may meet the eligibility criteria for Paralympic competition

RYA Scotland endeavours to keep those athletes who feel they may ultimately be eligible for the Paralympics within mainstream race and race training programmes for as long as is practically possible, as we consider this the most effective way to facilitate their development. Athletes are then either transferred across to the Olympic programme or the Paralympic programme, or invited to participate in both of them in parallel should this be considered most effective. Athletes or parents who would like further advice or feel they may meet the relevant criteria are encouraged to discuss in more detail with the RYA Scotland HPM.



Scottish Team Ages and Composition

Athletes should fall within the RYA UK Youth or Junior Squad age range for the class they are sailing at time of selection. RYA Scotland aims to ensure that present and potential team members are treated on an equal basis irrespective of gender, disability, race, religious belief or social status. Team members will be selected on their ability or potential ability shown as stated in the discretionary criteria.

Indicator Events

Indicator events will be Class UK National Championships, Class European Championships, Class World Championships, RYA Youth Championships, RYA Scotland Physical Profiling Day and UK Youth & Junior Squad Selection.

Where there is an overlap in dates between UK and International Competition the latter will be seen as the primary event.

Discretionary Criteria

When considering the discretionary criteria the selectors may take into consideration any of the following factors:

- Performance at indicator events
- Age and potential
- Age adjusted results
- Factors affecting results
- Attitude and behavior
- Application assessment
- Class ranking list
- Height and weight
- Goals and aspirations
- Programme of racing and training
- Other factors the selection committee considers appropriate

Exceptional Circumstances or Failure to Attend Indicator Events

Athletes that are either:

1. Unable to attend the primary indicator events, due to exceptional circumstances.
2. Would like to make the selectors aware of any exceptional circumstance which could be considered during selection,

Selection Practice

Selectors have the discretion to determine;

- The size of the team
- Which of the criteria to take into account
- Who to select

In making their decision and exercising their discretions Selectors are expected to;

- Use their expertise and experience
- Rely on their observation of the competitors, together with the observations made by other individuals, such as team coaches and class representatives

By entering an event or activity that is part of the indicator series the competitors agree that the Selectors have such discretions. The Selection Committee may extend the selection process beyond the series.

The Selectors shall comprise of the RYA Scotland High Performance Manager, the RYA Scotland Head Coach and a nominated member of the RYA Scotland Performance Committee. The decision of the selectors shall be ratified by the RYA Scotland Performance Committee.

Application Process

There is no formal application process for the RYA Scotland Elite Team, sailors will instead be invited by the selectors.

Out of age athletes should write a formal letter for support to the RYA Scotland HPM by the end of March each year and will be eligible for consideration for a discretionary place.

Notification

All applicants will be notified in writing by email as soon as is practically possible after the selectors have met. Successful sailors' names will be published on the RYA Scotland website shortly after receiving team acceptance forms from the selected sailors. It is not our policy to publish this information before this time.

Appeals

There will be no appeals against the published selection criteria or the actions of the selectors, provided they follow the selection criteria. By entering the selection process sailors agree to this condition.

The grounds for appeal are limited to allegations of:

- I. Failure to follow due process
- II. Bias or undue influence
- III. Some other misconduct

The criteria for appeal may not include any alleged error of judgement of the selectors. Should an appeal still arise then it should initially be submitted in writing to the Performance Committee through the RYA Scotland Office within 5 days of the selection being announced.
