Welcome

Sian Reynolds, Chair of RYA Cymru Wales, welcomed everyone to the meeting and thanked them for attending.

1. Approval of the Minutes of Previous AGM

Approval of the minutes of the 2023 AGM held on 30 March 2024 was proposed by Ken Newing, seconded by Jo Powell, and carried unanimously with no abstentions.

2. Matters Arising

There were no matters arising from the minutes of the 2023 AGM.

3. Annual Review (to 31 March 2024)

The Review reflects and reports on the achievements of our communities and sport during the year, and the successes are testament to the dedication of RYACW staff, volunteers, clubs and training



centres across Wales; it showcases the impressive achievements of our youth sailors, and reflects on the new initiatives implemented.

Dedicated club members Mark Govier (Merthyr Tydfil SC), and Jacob Knock and Julian Bridges (PDSC) were recognised, at the November 2023 RYA Volunteer Awards, for their invaluable contributions to their clubs and to our sport, whilst Gresford Sailing Club was awarded the title of RYA Community Club of the Year at the RYA's Dinghy & Water Sports Show held in February 2024.

We are exceptionally proud of Micky Beckett and Chris Grube, who qualified to represent GBR at the 2024 Paris Olympics.

RYACW Club Development Officer, Hester Walker, has worked tirelessly with our affiliated clubs across Wales, including assisting in the delivery of free Discover Sailing sessions and supporting applications to the Sport Wales Be Active Fund, which secured £250,000 of grant funding across 16 Wales clubs. Performance Manager, Sarah McGovern, has been diligently organising training and equipment allocation to the Welsh Sailing teams, and has led the way with UK Anti-Doping training.

Our thanks go to Sport Wales, the RYA (the RYA Safeguarding team in particular), and the Reardon Smith Nautical Trust for their continued support.

4. Annual Accounts

The annual accounts, to 31 March 2024 as prepared by LHP Accountants, Tenby, and approved by the Board of Directors on 4 September 2024, were made available prior to the meeting and presented for approval. RYACW is pleased to announce the recent appointment to the Board of a volunteer Financial Director, Jon Frost.

The turnover for the year was £510,181, a slight increase on the previous year but overwhelmingly due to an additional one-off Sport Wales Cost of Living grant in the sum of £26,000; this will be distributed in a number of different ways, including for the subsidising of various instructor courses. In summary, grant funding received from Sport Wales, derived from the Lottery, is channelled into pathway and performance activities, whist monies from Exchequer funding is biased towards development and club activity.



The 2023-2024 year saw a planned deficit, financed from surplus reserves, in order to support the organisational changes through the performance period, whilst still maintaining a healthy level of net current assets, required to indemnify the company against potential financial risk.

The RYACW Board continues to monitor and assess the investment of resources to ensure RYA attains its strategic objectives.

Approval of the 2023-2024 annual accounts was proposed by Emily Cook, seconded by Mark Govier, and carried unanimously with no abstentions.

5. Appointment of Accountants

Following a routine investigation into the costs and services provided by Wales-based accountancy practices, upon recommendation it is proposed that Arthur Gait & Company Ltd, Newport, be appointed for the preparation of the 2024-2025 annual accounts.

Approval of Arthur Gait & Company Ltd proposed by Emily Cook, seconded by Rob Ingram, and carried unanimously with no abstentions.

6. Appointment of Nominated Director

Andrew Williams became a member of Merthyr Tydfil Sailing Club approximately 8 years ago, and has been part of the huge drive to rejuvenate the club by encouraging more youth sailors and investing in a new clubhouse and new equipment.

It is proposed that Andrew be appointed to the RYACW Board of Directors, whilst simultaneously being appointed as Chair of the newly-formed Development Sub-Committee.

Appointment of Andrew Williams proposed by Ken Newing, seconded by Mark Jones, and carried unanimously with no abstentions.

7. Any Other Business

No motions for consideration had been received, and therefore there was no further business to consider.

Sian Reynolds thanked all those in attendance, with a special thanks to Nicola Penny for attending in the role of independent scrutineer.



There being no further business, the meeting concluded at 1700 hrs, and was followed by an informal "Meet the Team".
