The Youth Director will be under the age of 25 years at the date of appointment.</p>

To lead the engagement of young people in RYA Scotland decision making processes. 4. To represent the interests of young people on the RYA Scotland Board. 5. To champion the interests of young people across RYA affiliated clubs and class associations in Scotland. 6. Act as a key link to school and University sailing in Scotland. 7. To lead efforts to bring more young people to boating as described in the RYA Scotland Strategy.
